

SDGs as an opportunity for rethinking the engagement of SAIs in auditing government operations and governance issues




The implementation of SDGs has emphasised the importance of audit and has definitely impacted SAIs and the way audit work could be carried out in assisting the UN in achieving its objectives.

Four Approaches To Achieve SDGs



Approach 1- Preparedness of National Governments and Readiness of National Systems and Data

Working closely with INTOSAI

Audit the countries' readiness

Providing regional education and training activities

Collating information on countries 'baseline

Readiness to produce regional report

Approach 2 - Conducting Performance Audits on SDGs



2. Formation of the Working Group on SDGs

Terms of Reference:

- Compiling and coordinating information on SDGs' implementation amongst ASOSAI member countries
- identifying the commonality and priority amongst ASOSAI countries with regards to implementing the SDGs.
- ➤ Identifying strategies for capacity building and knowledge sharing
- Study on widening the scope to include the audit on the financial information in performance audit and audit on non-financial information in financial and compliance audits

- Integrating the audits and reviews of SDGs into the mainstream audits
- 4. Use of open data/Big Data/Data analytic
- 5. Active collaborations and interactions among regions
