**MALACCA:** The National Security Division of the Prime Minister's Department will be asked clarify an Auditor-General's report on the misuse of the special fund for tsunami aid.

Minister in the Prime Minister's Department Datuk Seri Nazri Aziz was reported to have said he would also raise the matter at Cabinet level.

On another matter, Najib, who is Defence Minister, expressed regret that six soldiers had been detained in connection with a break-in at a handphone shop in Sungai Petani.

He wants the police to carry out investigations and punish the soldiers if they had committed the crime. He said the armed forces would also carry out its probe into the matter.

"We are firm on this matter," he said.

Earlier, Najib said the Government was looking for genuine entrepreneurs to help in generating the country's economy.

"We have to be serious in talent-scouting and look for those who are 100% focused in business," he added.

Najib said the country needed businessmen able to face obstacles in challenging situations.

"The Malays need to have new ideas, creativity and innovation in order to compete in the globalised world," he said.
