NADM Recovers RM123 Million In Unremitted Revenue Following Audit Act Amendment

PUTRAJAYA, May 27 (Bernama) -- The National Audit Department (NADM) has **recovered** approximately RM123 million in previously unpaid revenues since the amendment to the Audit Act 1957 (Act 62), which came into force last year, said Auditor-General Datuk Seri Wan Suraya Wan Mohd Radzi.

She said the department has also tracked incomplete infrastructure projects that have been carried out in coordination with the auditors.

"...after the Act was amended, we have been able to follow through on a lot of the issues highlighted in previous reports (The Auditor-General's Report).

"We have followed up on about RM123 million in unpaid revenues. We have followed up on infrastructure that was not done, through various platforms that we have with our auditors," she said at the ASEAN Auditor Conference 2025 here today.

Wan Suraya was one of the panelists for the high-level dialogue session titled Enhancing Public Sector Auditing Through Follow-Up Audit, moderated by Deputy Auditor-General Azman Mahmood.

The other two panellists were the Philippines' Commission on Audit Chairperson Garnaliel Asis Cordoba and Indonesia's Audit Board Director General of Audit VII Pranoto.

Wan Suraya added that the revised Act empowers the Auditor-General to take action on issues or make formal recommendations when serious irregularities are uncovered.

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"This process ensures transparency and compels relevant ministries and agencies to justify their responses or inaction. This is a clear focus on turning findings into measurable action. We want to know what they are going to do to fix whatever deficiencies or inefficiencies are identified in the report," she added.

Earlier, the conference also featured a keynote address by the Secretary-General of ASEAN Dr Kao Kim Hourn, delivered via video message.

In his remarks, he highlighted the credibility and vital role of auditors across the public, private and internal audit sectors, while calling for stronger regional and cross-sector collaboration to build a trusted and competent audit profession.

In line with Malaysia's ASEAN Chairmanship in 2025 and the appointment of Malaysia's Auditor-General as Chair of the ASEAN Audit Committee, NADM is hosting the inaugural ASEAN Auditor Conference 2025 from today until tomorrow at the Putrajaya International Convention Centre.

The conference convenes 2,243 participants from public and private sectors, including regional and international delegates and several Heads of Supreme Audit Institutions from ASEAN and beyond, such as Brunei, the Philippines, Cambodia, Laos, the Maldives and Yemen.

"... selepas akta itu dipinda, kami dapat membuat tindakan susulan terhadap banyak isu yang telah diketengahkan dalam Laporan Ketua Audit Negara sebelum ini.

"Kami membuat tindakan susulan terhadap kira-kira RM123 juta hasil yang tidak dibayar. Kami juga telah mengambil tindakan terhadap projek infrastruktur yang tidak dilaksanakan melalui pelbagai platform yang ada bersama juruaudit kami," katanya semasa Persidangan Juruaudit ASEAN 2025 di sini hari ini.

Wan Suraya ialah seorang daripada ahli panel dalam sesi dialog peringkat tinggi bertajuk "Enhancing Public Sector Auditing Through Follow-Up Audit" yang dipengerusikan oleh Timbalan Ketua Audit Negara Azman Mahmood.

Dua lagi panel terdiri Pengerusi Suruhanjaya Audit Filipina Gamaliel Asis Cordoba dan Ketua Pengarah Audit VII Lembaga Audit Indonesia Pranoto.

Wan Suraya berkata pindaan akta juga memberikan kuasa kepada ketua audit negara untuk mengambil tindakan atau membuat syar rasmi sekiranya mengesan terdapatnya penyelewengan yang serius.

"Ini sebahagian daripada kuasa baharu yang diberikan. Saya juga ingin menyetuh mengenai usaha kami untuk memperkuh kebertanggungjawaban melalui Parlimen, memandangkan laporan kami juga dibahaskan.

"Proses ini memastikan ketelusan dan memaksa kementerian serta agensi berkaitan memberi justifikasi terhadap tindakan atau ketiadaan tindakan. Kami mahu tahu apakah langkah yang akan diambil bagi menangani kelemahan atau ketidakcekapan yang dikenal pasti dalam laporan," katanya.

Terdahulu, persidangan itu turut menampilkan ucapan oleh Setiausaha Agung ASEAN Dr Kao Kim Hourn yang disampaikan melalui mesej video.

Dalam ucapannya itu, beliau menyetuh mengenai kredibiliti dan peranan penting juruaudit dalam sektor awam, swasta dan audit dalaman, sambil menyeru kerjasama yang lebih kukuh di peringkat serantau dan merentas sektor untuk membina profesion audit yang dipercayai dan kompeten.

Selaras dengan Kepengerusan ASEAN oleh Malaysia pada tahun ini dan pelantikan Ketua Audit Negara Malaysia sebagai Pengerusi Jawatankuasa Audit ASEAN, JAN dianjurkan Persidangan Juruaudit ASEAN 2025 yang julung kali diadakan, bermula hari ini hingga esok di Pusat Konvensyen Antarabangsa Putrajaya.

ASEAN perlu beralih menjadi blok tadbir urus - KSN

PUTRAJAYA: ASEAN perlu beralih daripada sekadar sebuah blok geografi kepada blok tadbir urus susulan penjajaran semula perdagangan yang sedang berlaku, ketidaktentuan rantaian bekalan dan persaingan kuasa besar dunia.

Ketua Setiausaha Negara, Tan Sri Shamsul Azri Abu Bakar, berkata cabaran ini bukan lagi ancaman pada masa depan, sebaliknya sudah dirasai dalam harga makanan, rancangan infrastruktur dan pasaran buruh.

"Bagi ASEAN, cabaran ini menjadi lebih kompleks kerana kepelbagaian ekonomi, keupayaan dan sistem tadbir urus kita, namun inilah juga kekuatan kita.

"Keupayaan kita untuk menyesuaikan diri, bekerjasama dan menjunjung prinsip bersama seperti ketelusan, akauntabiliti dan keterangkuman adalah penentu masa depan serantau," katanya dalam ucapan perasmian Persidangan Juruaudit ASEAN 2025 anjuran Jabatan Audit Negara (JAN) di sini, hari ini.

Teks ucapan beliau dibacakan Ketua Audit Negara, Datuk Seri Wan Suraya Wan Mohd Radzi.

Shamsul Azri berkata, tadbir urus pada masa kini bukan lagi hanya mengenai kawalan, sebaliknya perlu mewujudkan kepercayaan dalam kalangan rakyat ASEAN yang semakin berhubung, bermaklumat dan mengharapkan integriti lebih tinggi.

"Institusi awam kita mesti bertindak balas bukan dengan birokrasi tetapi dengan keberanian, keterbukaan dan kecekapan. Perkhidmatan awam kita perlu cukup tangkas menterjemahkan cabaran makro ini kepada pembaharuan mikro.

"Usaha pembaharuan perkhidmatan awam di Malaysia didorong agenda yang menyeluruh dan terancang, berpaksikan kepada lima teras reformasi, iaitu nilai serta tadbir urus, modal insan, pembangunan organisasi, penyampaian perkhidmatan dan sinergi awam-swasta," katanya.

Beliau berkata, kepentingan kerjasama turut semakin meningkat dalam sektor awam ASEAN dengan pihak berkepentingan perlu memainkan peranan lebih besar seperti juruaudit, penggubal dasar dan peneraju tadbir urus digital saling bekerjasama untuk mencipta nilai.

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Asean must transition into governance bloc – govt chief secretary

PUTRAJAYA (May 27): Amid ongoing global trade realignments, supply chain uncertainties and great power rivalries, Asean must evolve from being merely a geographical bloc into a governance bloc, Chief Secretary to the Government Tan Sri Shamsul Azri Abu Bakar said.

He said these challenges are no longer distant or abstract, as they are being felt directly through rising food prices, infrastructure planning disruptions, and in labour markets.

"For Asean, these challenges are compounded by the diversity of our economies, capacities and governance systems, but this is also our strength.

"Our ability to adapt, to cooperate and to uphold shared principles of transparency, accountability and inclusiveness, is what will define our regional future," he said in his opening remarks at the Asean Auditor Conference 2025 here on Tuesday, organised by the National Audit Department of Malaysia (NADM).

His speech text was read out by Auditor General Datuk Seri Wan Suraya Wan Mohd Radzi.

Shamsul Azri said governance today is no longer about control, but about fostering trust, particularly in an Asean region, where citizens are increasingly informed, connected, and expect greater integrity from public institutions.

"Our public institutions must respond not with bureaucracy, but with boldness, openness and competence. Our public service must be agile enough to translate these macro challenges into micro reforms.

"In Malaysia, our public service reform journey is driven by a comprehensive and deliberate agenda, one anchored on five reform thrusts, namely value and governance, human capital, organisational development, service delivery and public-private synergy," he added.

Shamsul Azri also underscored the growing need for collaboration within the Asean public sector, calling for greater cooperation among auditors, policymakers, and digital governance leaders to create public value.

PUTRAJAYA, 27 Mei- ASEAN disaran untuk memperkukuh kerjasama dalam tadbir urus serantau bagi menghadapi cabaran global yang semakin kompleks termasuk ketidaktentuan rantaian bekalan, penjajaran semula perdagangan serta persaingan kuasa besar dunia.

Malaysia calls on Asean to move beyond geography, lead as a governance bloc

At the inaugural Asean Auditor Conference, Malaysia's top civil servant urges public institutions to prioritise bold reforms and regional cooperation in the face of global volatility

The conference's theme, "Inclusive and Sustainable Auditing for a Progressive Asean", highlighted the growing role of Supreme Audit Institutions (SAIs) in shaping resilient economies.

Shamsul noted that Malaysia had expanded the Auditor General's remit through amendments to the Audit Act 1957, enabling scrutiny of companies backed by government guarantees.

He also emphasised the strategic importance of follow-up audits in ensuring that public sector reforms translate into tangible outcomes, particularly in people-centric initiatives such as flood mitigation, digital education, and clean energy transition.

"We see a greater role for Asean's public sector ecosystem – where auditors, policymakers and digital innovators co-create value," he said.

As Asean moves to harmonise ESG audit frameworks and prepare for the disruptions of artificial intelligence, Shamsul urged SAIs to lead with foresight and collective will.

He expressed hope that such efforts would be reflected in improved anti-corruption metrics. Malaysia's Corruption Perceptions Index (CPI) ranking currently stands at 57th with a score of 50 points – unchanged from 2023. However, the government aims to reach the top 25 globally by 2033.

"From the policymaker in Putrajaya to the auditor in Vientiane, everyone has a role to play in delivering integrity, justice and opportunity," he said.

KUALA LUMPUR – Asean must rise beyond being a mere geographical entity and take bold strides towards becoming a governance bloc if it is to meet the challenges of an increasingly volatile global landscape, Chief Secretary to the Government (KSN) Tan Sri Shamsul Azri Abu Bakar said today.

Speaking through Auditor-General Datuk Seri Wan Suraya Wan Mohd Radzi at the opening of the Asean Auditors Conference 2025 held at the Putrajaya International Convention Centre (PICC), Shamsul said the region's public service institutions must be agile, future-focused and prepared to turn global uncertainties into local reforms.

"As the global economy shifts, the public sector cannot afford to sit on the sidelines," he said.

"With ongoing trade realignments, supply chain uncertainties, and great power rivalries, Asean must become more than a geographical bloc – we must become a governance bloc."

The landmark event, held in tandem with the Asean Summit, gathered over 2,000 participants from audit institutions, regulators, accounting firms, corporations, and academia.

This alignment of policy discussions at the summit with implementation deliberations at the conference, Shamsul said, marks the region's growing maturity in balancing shared prosperity with shared responsibility.

He added that good governance was no longer about control but about enabling trust – particularly at a time when Asean citizens are more connected, informed, and expect greater transparency.

"Our institutions must respond not with bureaucracy, but with boldness, openness and competence."

Citing Malaysia's five-pronged public sector reform agenda – encompassing value and governance, human capital, organisational development, service delivery and public-private synergy – Shamsul said the country's experience could serve as a model adaptable to Asean's diverse national contexts.

"Malaysia's public sector reform is not just a domestic imperative. It is a regional opportunity," he said.

Malaysia seru reformasi sektor awam dan kerjasama serantau

PUTRAJAYA, 27 Mei: Malaysia menyeru negara-negara ASEAN untuk tampil sebagai blok tadbir urus serantau dalam menghadapi ketidaktentuan ekonomi global yang semakin mencabar.

Ketua Setiausaha Negara, Tan Sri Shamsul Azri Abu Bakar berkata, sektor awam perlu menjadi lebih tangkas bagi menterjemahkan cabaran global yang berlaku ketika ini.

“Sektor awam tidak boleh berpeluk tubuh ketika ekonomi global terus berubah.

“Menerusi penajaran semula perdagangan yang sedang berlaku, ketidaktentuan rantaian bekalan, dan persaingan kuasa besar, ASEAN mesti menjadi lebih daripada sekadar blok geografi,” katanya.

PERDANA Menteri Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim menggesa juruaudit, akauntan dan pengawal selia di seluruh ASEAN supaya memperkukuh komitmen mereka terhadap tadbir urus yang baik, berteraskan nilai murni serta maruah dalam melaksanakan tanggungjawab.

‘Juruaudit, akauntan tak cukup sekadar cemerlang teknikal’

Putrajaya: Juruaudit, akauntan dan pengawal selia di seluruh ASEAN harus menggunakan tadbir urus yang baik berteraskan nilai dan maruah manusia dalam melaksanakan tanggungjawab mereka.

Pardana Menteri, Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim, berkata kes-cemerlangan teknikal semata-mata tidak mencukupi tanpa disertai ketelusan, kebertanggungjawaban dan kejelasan moral terutama dalam konteks membina institusi yang bebas serta berintegriti.

Katanya, sistem audit yang baik bukan hanya untuk memastikan kewangan awam yang kukuh, tetapi harus berperanan menegakkan prinsip etika dan nilai kemanusiaan universal.

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Audit firms need to act independently, says Anwar

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PUTRAJAYA: There have been previous occasions where major audit firms were complicit in financial scandals, says Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim.

He said this was because the audit firms, including the larger firms, were not entirely free from becoming the target of excesses.

"Here in this country but also in the more developed, industrialised countries, there has been complicity at times.

"If you look, for example, at the 1MDB scandal, there was complicity with the big audit firms.

"This is why audit firms should be empowered to operate independently so that they can follow the trail of accountability wherever it leads," he said when closing the Asean Auditor Conference here yesterday.

In this respect, the Prime

Minister lauded the efforts by Auditor-General Datuk Seri Wan Suraya Wan Mohd Radzi despite shouldering the unpopular job of conducting audits.

"That is why we have this 'woman of steel' as the Auditor-General. It is a tough and extreme-

ly unpopular task, but it doesn't matter to her as she is not contesting in the elections," he said.

Anwar noted that while good governance is important, the role played by independent auditor firms and the Auditor-General Department is pivotal in ensur-

ing accountability.

"I have mentioned this to my Cabinet colleagues that even I don't determine what should be the results or the priority of the Auditor-General's Report.

"They had, of course, briefed me over the past two weeks or so

on the report. But they briefed me not for me to interfere and change what their report had said.

"The briefing is for me to present it to the Cabinet before it is tabled in Parliament for debate. This is what is meant to have good governance and transparency."

Anwar said the independence of such audit reports would also strengthen good governance and integrity within the administration.

"This will ultimately be reflected in sustaining continued improvements in the Corruption Perception Index (CPI)," he added.

Anwar said this was the message he had stressed during the Asean Summit for audit firms to act independently to ensure good governance and accountability.

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
